April 10: Real Americans by Rachel Khong



Exuberant and explosive, Real Americans is a social novel par excellence that asks: Are we destined, or made, and if so, who gets to do the making? Can our genetic past be overcome?

May 8: Martyr! by Kaveh Akbar

Led by David Turk, retired Professor of English. Kaveh Akbar's Martyr! is a paean to how we spend

our lives seeking meaning—in faith, art, ourselves, others—in which a newly sober, orphaned son of Iranian immigrants, guided by the voices of artists, poets, and kings, embarks on a search that leads him to a terminally ill painter living out her final days in the Brooklyn Museum.



June 12: Assembly by Natasha Brown

Led by Vara Neverow, Professor of English at Southern

Connecticut State University. The narrator of Assembly is a Black British woman. She is preparing to attend a lavish garden party at her boyfriend's family estate, set deep in the English countryside. At the same time, she is considering the carefully assembled pieces of herself. As the minutes tick



down and the future beckons, she can't escape the question: is it time to take it all apart?

2024 ANNUAL REPORT TO THE COMMUNITY

Dear Neighbor,

In 2024, the library completed the final steps of the 2023 flood recovery and in achieving goals outlined in our strategic plan. By the year's end the most visible change was our new Reference Desk. This important service point, damaged during the flood, was redesigned with staff input and enhances our ability to meet the current needs of users. The new location is also a preview of exciting things to come in 2025 including the construction of an expanded Teen Space and three individual quiet study rooms designed for online meetings. Towards this project, \$109,061 was secured through the NYS Construction Aid application process.

Adding to an already impressive slate of community programming, the library hosted a Repair Café and partnered with the Nyack Library for a BIPOC business spotlight weekend. The "For Future Reference" internship graduated its second cohort of students who learned about library service careers. And in further collaboration we marched with our Nyack Library colleagues in the Pride parade.

Significant improvements were made to the wifi infrastructure through increasing the number of access points in the building and introducing a fiber optic connection resulting in improved speed and connectivity even in our furthest corners.

As always, none of this could happen without you. Thank you for your support.
